## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION FOR OCTOBER (For the Synod) - "We pray for the Church, that she may adopt listening and dialogue as a lifestyle at every level, and allow herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit towards the peripheries of the world." TABERNACLE, STATUES AND IMAGES RELOCATIONS - It is said that any statue/ image of Jesus looks like Jesus, but he is not. The Blessed Sacrament, in the other hand, does not look like Jesus, but he is. Images and statues are pure representations. Whereas, the Blessed Sacrament, according to our Catholic belief, is not a mere symbol; it is the whole Christ truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity. That is why we do not just venerate but worship and adore the Blessed Sacrament for it is Jesus who is really and truly present. If in our catholic belief Christ is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, then there's no need for him to be represented with the image of the divine mercy (presently on top of the tabernacle), no need for him to be represented by the statue of the sacred heart (presently beside the tabernacle) because Jesus who himself is the divine mercy and the sacred heart is present real and actual in the Blessed Sacrament inside the Tabernacle. Statues & images of Jesus, sacred as they are, could take our attention away from the real presence of Christ when we come to adore our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. With these explanations plus instructions from the office of the bishop, soon we will move the statue of the sacred heart and the image of the divine mercy away from the tabernacle, or the tabernacle itself will be relocated to the center of the sanctuary behind the altar, beneath the crucifix. All of the relocations of the things mentioned will all be done according to the liturgical norms and approval from the bishop's office. I thank you all for your kind understanding.
