MARTYRS FOR CHRISTIAN FAITH — "In history, hundreds of early Christians have faced persecution for their faith. It is believed that the Roman Catholic Church was born out of the martyrdom of its members. A Christian martyr is someone willing to face death rather than deny Jesus Christ or his Gospel. Beheading, stoning, crucifixion, throwing to lion's dens, and burning at stake were some of the horrific ways they were punished for their beliefs."

ST. IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH - (October 17) St. Ignatius became the third bishop of Antioch, following Sts. Peter and Paul. In AD 107, the brutal Emperor Trajan who was ruling over Rome, unfairly sentenced Ignatius to death since he refused to renounce Christianity and held firm to his faith and also refused to follow Roman gods. As a result, he was sentenced to death by being torn to pieces and eaten by lions in the Colosseum as 87,000 Romans approved and applauded. He went joyfully to his death with the name of Jesus on his lips and in his heart. In his letter to the Romans, Saint Ignatius wrote: "Allow me to become food for the wild beasts, through whose means it will be granted me to reach God. I am the wheat of God, and am ground by the teeth of the wild beasts, that I may be found the pure bread of Christ." Great faith can be found in few men, and in fewer men can greater faith be found than in that of St. Ignatius of Antioch. "Christianity is greatest when it is hated by the world." — Ignatius. St. Ignatius of Antioch was the first person to use the term 'Catholic' to describe the church as universal.


