St. Jean de Brebeuf, Scalped & Eaten Alive - (A Christian martyr is someone willing to face death rather than deny Jesus Christ or his Gospel. Beheading, stoning, crucifixion, throwing to lion's dens, and burning at stake were some of the horrific ways they were punished for their beliefs.) Brébeuf born in France, was ordained a priest in 1623, and came to Midland, Ontario, Canada in 1625. Noted for his facility with language, he was assigned to Christianize the Huron people between Georgian Bay and Lake Huron. During his mission to spread Christianity among the native population, he was captured by the Iroquois. St. John de Brebeuf was then scalped. After scalping him, they began to slowly cut pieces from his body and eat his flesh in front of his own eyes. As part of the ritual, the Iroquois drank his blood and ate his heart, as they wanted to absorb Brébeuf's courage in enduring the pain. After they had finished eating him, they poured boiling water over him and finished him off with red-hot hatchets. Since 1940, Saint John de Brebeuf is celebrated as one of the patron saints of Canada."


