<u>FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING</u> - The Feast of Christ the King is a festival celebrated in the Roman Catholic Church in honor of Jesus Christ as lord over all creation. It was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 and is celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, immediately preceding Advent . The feast was established and proclaimed by the Pope to reassert the sovereignty of Christ and the Church over all forms of government and to remind Christians of the fidelity and loyalty they owed to Christ, who by his Incarnation and sacrificial death on the cross had made them both adopted children of God and future citizens and heirs of the Kingdom of Heaven. The Christian belief in Christ's sovereignty and the call to live by His teachings are recalled on the Feast of Christ the King. It offers a significant close to the liturgical year and ushers in the Advent season, which is centered on expectation and being ready for Christ's return .
