SUNDAYS OF ORDINARY TIME AND COLOR GREEN - Ordinary Time is a liturgical season (33 or 34 weeks) that falls outside of the major liturgical seasons such as Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. During Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the fullness of the mystery of Christ. The significance of Sundays of Ordinary Time is that they provide an opportunity to know Christ more intimately in the everyday realities of life. It is a time during which we can grow closer to the Lord and deepen our spiritual lives. Green is the standard color for Ordinary Time. Green symbolizes the hope and life of each new day. Ordinary Time is, for Catholics, the opportunity to allow the Lord to stir up our faith, to allow our spirits to rise and to grow in our spiritual life. The color green brings this meaning to the fore, since it is a color that evokes life and growth.

MAN'S DESIRE FOR GOD - The desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for: The dignity of man rests above all on the fact that he is called to communion with God. This invitation to converse with God is addressed to man as soon as he comes into being. For if man exists, it is because God has created him through love, and through love continues to hold him in existence. He cannot live fully according to truth unless he freely acknowledges that love and entrusts himself to his creator."

NEW YEAR WITH HOPE - New Year is a time to reflect on the previous year and celebrate the arrival of a new one. God knows that we all struggle with finding and holding onto hope. When we are facing tests of faith, even the strongest Christians can find it a challenge to find hope. When we need encouragement and refreshment for our soul, we can turn to these Scriptures from the Old and New Testaments that offer hope and encouragement: Romans 15:153, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. " Hebrews 10:23, "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful." Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future". Psalm 33:18, "But the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, on those whose hope is in his unfailing love." Roman 5:3, "But we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope.



FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world. After being made known to the shepherds, he is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East and journey to Bethlehem to adore him, the newly born Messiah. The Magi being non-Jews but Gentiles, represent the entire world in search of the Saviour. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological. Gold is presented as representative of Jesus' kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple.
