practice of so-called surrogate motherhood, which represents a grave violation of the dignity of the woman and the child, based on the exploitation of situations of the mother's material needs. A child is always a gift and never the basis of a commercial contract," he said.

WHY SUNDAY WORSHIP FOR CHRISTIANS & NOT SATURDAY? - The Sabbath is on Saturday, as it was in the Old Testament and as it is observed by Jews today. Christians, though, celebrate Sunday instead, because after Jesus enunciated a new covenant, his emphasis turned to be on Sundays (first day of the week). Sunday was the day he was found to have been resurrected, and his first two appearances to the twelve disciples were on the following two Sundays. Again, Sunday was when the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles (Pentecost). What Christians are celebrating instead of the sabbath is "the Lord's Day," and that has been happening since the first century. As early as the time of the apostles as testified by St. Paul, Sunday (first day of the week) became the day of worship. Paul said in the Acts of the Apostles 20:7: "On the first day of the week, when we gathered to break bread." This has been confirmed by the Fathers of the Church. In 110, St. Ignatius, bishop of Antioch and disciple of the apostle John, proclaimed: "Let every friend of Christ keep the Lord's Day as a festival, the resurrection-day, the queen and chief of all the days." Justin Martyr: "On Sunday, we meet to celebrate the Lord's supper and read the Gospels and Sacred Scripture, the first day on which God changed darkness, and made the world, and on which Christ rose from the dead." Clearly, both the Bible and the Holy Tradition confirm that Sunday is the day of worship observed since the earliest Christians.

THE ORDINARY TIME AND COLOR GREEN - Ordinary Time is a liturgical season (33 or 34 weeks) that falls outside of the major liturgical seasons such as Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. During Ordinary Time, the gospel readings throughout this season walk us through the life of Christ, inviting immersion into his teachings, parables, way of being with humans, and way of being with God. Interestingly, Ordinary Time commences with the Gospel with John the Baptist pointing us and introduces us to Jesus saying: "Look, here's the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." As Ordinary Time reveals Jesus to us, it calls us to adopt the ways of Jesus for ourselves and to let his life become our own. Ordinary Time provides us an opportunity to know Christ more intimately in the everyday realities of life. It is a time during which we can grow closer to the Lord and deepen our spiritual lives. GREEN is the standard color for Ordinary Time. Green symbolizes the hope and life of each new day. Ordinary Time is, for Catholics, the opportunity to allow the Lord to stir up our faith, to allow our spirits to rise and to grow in our spiritual life. The color green brings this meaning to the fore, since it is a color that evokes life and growth. Fr. FR.
