FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

TAX RECEIPTS 2023 - Your Tax Receipts 2023 are now available and you can pick them up at the church entrance. Through our continuing concerted efforts and our financial support, we are the foundations of our beloved parish church of Assumption. Your Sunday offerings & donations are gifts that could not be more appreciated. Your contribution is vital to the life of the parish, and we'd want to express our gratitude for it. LENT - Lent is the Christian season of spiritual preparation before Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday. During Lent, Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial, and spiritual discipline. The purpose of the Lenten season is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ—to consider his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial, and resurrection. The 40-day period of Lent is based on two episodes of spiritual testing in the Bible: the 40 years of wilderness wanderings by the Israelites after the exodus from Egypt and the Temptation of Jesus after he spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness. In the Bible, the number 40 holds special significance: In Noah's time, the deluge lasted 40 days; Moses fasted on the mountain for 40 days before God gave the Ten Commandments; God gave people of Nineveh 40 days to repent; David was transformed by Goliath's 40-day challenge; Prophet Elijah walks 40 days and 40 nights to Mount Horeb; The disciples were transformed by 40 days with Jesus after his resurrection. KNITTING WOOL - "If you have any extra or unused knitting wool and would like to donate it to a worthy cause, please bring it here in the church during any weekend and leave it in the St. Vincent box at the back. We have a lady who makes and donates winter hats and other items to those in the community who need them. The more wool she has, the more she will make. Any colors, no matter the amount, are welcome."

<u>STATIONS OF THE CROSS</u> - In all Fridays within the season of Lent, all are invited to join the Stations of the Cross after the 9:00 Mass in the morning. The objective of the stations of the cross is to help the Christian faithful to make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion of Christ. Despite the darkness of Good Friday, the Stations point us toward Easter Sunday.
