FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

CHRIST'S TRANSFIGURATION - The Transfiguration is significant because it reveals Jesus' divine nature and his identity as the Son of God. It was the glorification of the body of Jesus, and those with Him saw Jesus in His glory. The appearance of Moses and Elijah testified that Jesus was the one of whom the law and prophets spoke. The approving testimony of God the Father further confirmed the identity of Jesus. And when God spoke from heaven saying, "This is my Son, listen to him", he was making a declaration for all generations, including our own, that we must listen only to his Son, and that there is one to whom all the world must listen, and that one is Jesus Christ. The transfiguration served as a manifestation of God's glory and power, and it was a foreshadowing of Jesus' resurrection and his ultimate triumph over sin and death.

LENT - At the start of the Season of Lent we always find the familiar Gospel reading about Christ in the wilderness, where he fasted 40 days and endured the temptations of the devil. Satan dared to tempt the most holy Jesus the Son of God. This gives us the heads up, that the devil does not respect anyone, even God. Temptation is a very real part of life. It is right at where we are. The devil knows that people are easy prey to temptations in times of dire needs. When we are helpless, discouraged, afraid, disappointed, and lonely, Satan loves to kick us when we're down. But while he will always take advantage of our human weaknesses, he can also make use of our human strength for our own downfall. Lent is the opportune time the church has set aside for us to be reminded how our Lord Jesus has set a proven strategy to defeat the devil, our ultimate spiritual enemy; that is, by aligning himself to the will of the Father and by intensive self-restraint, prayer and fasting. In this life, we will always be tempted, and we will be tried to know whether our faith is genuine or not. Thus, no less than Jesus himself gives us a strong reminder, "Pray without ceasing lest you fall into temptation". And Peter in his first letter also reminds us saying, "Be sober and alert. The devil is roaming around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith." This is the good news that Lent teaches us: for every temptation being overcome, there is a corresponding grace we receive, for every single devil's advances that we ward off, there is a corresponding God's reward.
