FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

LAETARE SUNDAY - The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday. The term "Laetare" comes from the Latin word for "rejoice." The Mass today starts with, "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast". Laetare Sunday reminds us that through our sacrifices, we will soon taste great joy. It provides a reprieve from the quiet and somber atmosphere of the rest of Lent. This change indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide. It is a day of relaxation from normal Lenten rigours; a day of hope with Easter at last within sight. The joy of Easter being around the corner is symbolized by the color Rose/Pink dominating in most of the church's sanctuaries today.

<u>SATURDAY MASS</u> – Saturday evening Mass has been moved to 4 pm during winter. Now, with longer daylight, we'd like your opinion. Please indicate on the sheets at the back if you prefer the time to stay at 4 pm or be moved back to 5 pm on Saturdays. If it doesn't matter to you, please indicate that as well.

<u>POPE FRANCIS</u> - "Once again, brothers and sisters, I renew my invitation to pray for people who suffer the horror of war in Ukraine and the Holy Land, as well as in other parts of the world." "Let us pray for peace! May we ask the Lord for the gift of peace." In Gaza, the death toll continues to rise, with the number of Palestinian victims numbering over 30,700 since the start of the Israeli military's ground offensive."

THREE CROSSES BEFORE GOSPEL READING - Why do Catholics cross themselves 3 times before the Gospel? This gesture of signing ourselves with the Cross is a way of praying, "May the Lord be in my mind, on my lips and in my heart." It is said prior to the reading of the Gospel as a way of prayerfully inviting Christ to come to us in these ways as His sacred Word is proclaimed.
