ST. THOMAS, THE APOSTLE - How His Disbelief Strengthens Our Faith -"St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying and his unwillingness to believe the Resurrection of Christ, earning him the title, "The Doubting Thomas." After verifying the wounds were true, St. Thomas became convinced of the reality of the Resurrection and exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a public profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus. He never doubted the Lord again after that, and he dedicated his life to helping others to believe in Jesus. Thank God for 'Doubting Thomas'. His initial skepticism gives hope to all those who struggle with doubt, as his story shows that honest questioning can lead to sincere faith. In the end, Thomas emerged as a devoted follower of Christ, willing to give his life entirely for the gospel. His doubts healed the wounds of our own disbelief. Thomas the doubter became Thomas the model believer, an example for each one of us."

SIN OF DESPAIR & SIN OF PRESUMPTION - They are two sins against hope (CCC 2091). The sin of despair is losing hope in our salvation by failing to trust God. It is a spiritual state in which one believes that his/her sins are so large that God is incapable of forgiving, or that the sins exceed his own ability to overcome. In despair one believes his sin is too great to be forgiven, thus, he better not repent and seek forgiveness. The sin of presumption is losing hope by either relying on ourselves for our salvation instead of God or taking God's mercy for granted without fear. The sin of presumption is when a person assumes that God's mercy is a given without any genuine repentance or effort on our part. This attitude disregards the need for sincere conversion and cooperation with God's grace. In essence, presumption treats forgiveness as an entitlement rather than a gift that requires humility, contrition, and active participation in the process of reconciliation. In despair one believes that forgiveness is impossible just as in presumption one believes repentance is unnecessary or superfluous.


