THE FOUR LAST THINGS (Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell.) "Meditating on these 4 Last Things helps us orient our lives to what truly matters in this world, and knowing the reality of our future can help us make better choices in the present moment. With death and an afterlife in the picture, our lives have the chance to change, forcing us to consider the eternal consequences of our actions. Judgement: Right after we die, we will face judgement before God. He knows everything about us. God is the perfect Judge. He can never be unfair or unjust. He will determine if we should spend eternity in Heaven or Hell. The New Testament speaks of judgment primarily in its aspect of the final encounter with Christ in his second coming, but also repeatedly affirms that each will be rewarded immediately after death in accordance with his works and faith. The parable of the poor man Lazarus and the words of Christ on the cross to the good thief, as well as other New Testament texts speak of a final destiny of the soul. The particular judgment is the individual judgment that happens at the moment of death opposite to the final judgment, which occurs at the end of time when all the dead are resurrected."
