THE FOUR LAST THINGS (Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell.) "Meditating on these 4 Last Things helps us orient our lives to what truly matters in this world, and knowing the reality of our future can help us make better choices in the present moment. With death and an afterlife in the picture, our lives have the chance to change, forcing us to consider the eternal consequences of our actions. HEAVEN: This is where you want to go, if that wasn't already obvious. Heaven is a place of eternal, loving union with God, the source of all being, goodness, and beauty, the fulfillment of every human heart. So how do you go here? Only by dying in a state of grace through Christ in his Church. There's no other way! If you're wondering how Purgatory fits in here, it's a temporary place that some people who are sent to Heaven will have to endure in order to prepare for Heaven. It's not one of the "last things" because it's not a final state. Scripture speaks of heaven in images: life, light, peace, wedding feast, wine of the kingdom, the Father's house, the heavenly Jerusalem, paradise: 'no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him'" (CCC 1027). 

POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION FOR MAY- (For The Formation Of Men And

Women Religious And Seminarians) Let us pray that men and women religious and seminarians, grow in their own vocational journey through human, pastoral, spiritual and community formation, that leads them to be credible witnesses of the Gospel.

MAY, MONTH DEDICATED TO MARY- Month of May is traditionally dedicated to honoring the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Catholic Church. The month of May is the month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady, and it is the occasion for a moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month, Christians both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1). This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

<u>POPE FRANCIS</u> (Prayers for Haiti, Ukraine, Palestine, Israel, Myanmar)- "I am thinking of Haiti, where a state of emergency is in force and the population is desperate because of the collapse of the health system, the shortage of food, and the violence that drives people to flee." "I am thinking of "the tormented Ukraine, Palestine, Israel, the Rohingya and so many peoples suffering from war and violence. May the God of peace enlighten hearts so that the will for dialogue and reconciliation may grow in all."
