works of mercy are found in the teachings of Jesus and give us a model how we should treat all others, as if they were Christ in disguise. They are charitable actions by which we help our neighbors in their bodily needs. They respond to the basic needs of humanity as we journey together through this life. The seven Corporal Works of Mercy: Feed the Hungry, Give Drink to the Thirsty, Shelter the Homeless, Visit the Sick, Visit the Prisoners, Bury the Dead, and Give Alms to the Poor. 2. Give drink to the thirsty - Science tells us that water is the stuff of life; it is vital

for all living organisms and about 60 per cent of the human body weight is water – at birth, this may be as high as 75 per cent. No wonder then that our faith sees 'water' as a divine symbol of God's life in us and urges us to 'give water' physically and spiritually to others. (to be continued)

ST. BENEDICT (Feast Day July 11) - Born 480 in Italy. Key points about his inspiring life: 1. Monasticism and the Benedictine Rule- St. Benedict's most significant contribution was the establishment of the Benedictine Rule, a set of guidelines for monastic living. This rule emphasized prayer, work, and community, promoting a balanced and disciplined approach to life. It became the norm for monasticism across Europe, shaping the lives of countless monks and nuns. 2. Spiritual Journey- Shocked by the moral decay in Rome, Benedict withdrew to a cave near Subiaco, where he lived as a hermit. His deep faith and commitment to God fueled his spiritual journey. 3. Humility and Obedience- Benedict's advice on humility, silence, and obedience has inspired not only monastic communities but also various institutions and legislators. His teachings continue to resonate as part of the spiritual treasury of the Church. In recognition of the work of Benedictine monks in evangelizing and civilizing Europe during the Middle Ages, Pope Paul VI proclaimed St. Benedict the patron saint of all Europe in 1964. St. Benedict's life exemplifies the power of hard work, humility, and faith to overcome challenging circumstances. His influence extends beyond monasticism, serving as an inspiration to people of all backgrounds. Through his dedication, wisdom, and commitment to God, St. Benedict continues to inspire generations.
